Number and Place Value

Four Operations: Calculation: Mental methods;

Round any number up to 1 000 000 to the nearest 10, 100, 1000,

Add and subtract whole numbers with more than 4 digits, including using formal written methods

Multiply numbers up to 4 digits by a one- or two-digit number using a formal written method,
